Our teaching assistants next year will be Mr Roberts, Mrs Coburn, Mrs Braithwaite and Mrs Reece and we are currently in the process of recruiting an additional TA.

Teaching assistants will support the children as required depending on number of children in the class and the relative need of the children within it. Whilst teaching assistants will be based primarily with one class, the school is also flexible in how and where they work to best support our children.

Classroom arrangements will remain as they have been this year.

I am also able to share with you all that from next year we will be extending weekly class music tuition to include all children from Year 1 to Year 6, ensure all children from Year 1 to Year 6 attend swimming lessons for two half terms, continue running Forest School sessions for all and ensuring one PE lesson per week is led by a specialist sports coach.

More detailed information regarding class arrangements and timetables for each class will be sent out by class teachers towards the end of the term.

Staffing Departures

I am also able to share with you some staffing departures this summer.

Mr Davies has made the difficult decision to resign from his Higher-Level Teaching Assistant post this week as he seeks to complete the qualifications required to become a teacher. Unfortunately, his personal circumstance means that to fulfil his dream within a bearable timeframe, he must study fulltime so reluctantly leaves Newtown. Mr Davies goes with our best wishes, and we thank him for the difference he's made to lots of children during his time here. We wish him well and he will always be welcome at Newtown.

A big thank you to her for all her hard work and dedication over the course of this year. We wish her all the very best in the future as she moves onto pastures new and we're sure she will go on to have a very successful teaching career.

We are currently in the process of recruiting an additional teaching assistant to cover the remainder of Miss Brown's maternity cover, before her return next Spring.


