Hapa Zome, literally meaning "leaf dye", is a Japanese printmaking technique that uses the natural pigments in leaves and flowers to produce beautiful patterns... but none more beautiful than what our youngest children created. Well done all.

Holiday Activity and Food (HAF)

You will see at the end of this newsletter lots of information about Summer Clubs that children are invited to attend, often for a charge. However, the HAF Programme offers free places to some activities for those who meet the eligibility criteria. I have attached further information to this email but the main information for eligibility is as follows:

Core Eligibility:

There are free places available on the HAF programme for children and young people aged 4 (reception class age)* to 16, who:

- Receive benefits-related free school meals
- Ukrainian guests staying in Shropshire

Wider Eligibility:

Local authorities have discretion to use some of their funding to provide free or subsidised holiday club places for children and young people who are not in receipt of benefits related free school meals.

In Shropshire this includes:

• Children and young people who live in areas of high deprivation and/or from low-income households who are not in receipt of benefits related free school meals

There are a limited number of free places available for children and young people who meet the wider eligibility criteria of living in areas of high deprivation and/or from low-income households on the Shropshire HAF programme 2024.
