I have spent a significant amount of time this week with our Year 5 and 6 children who were at Robinwood Activity Centre for their residential. The children enjoyed 3 days of action-packed activities including caving, high-ropes, archery, giant swing and climbing.

I can't overstate how great it is to see the children challenge themselves and overcome real fears and develop personally on the duration of the course. These trips also give children a sense of independence as they spend time away from home – often for the first time – and sleep in a new place.

# **Supporting Maths at Home**

Arithmetic and Times Tables underpin all maths and at school we complete Arithmetic challenges every week. These challenges are stuck into Home School Journals so that parents can monitor attainment and progress of the children. It is also hoped that parents can support their child. The questions essentially stay the same every week, with just the numbers changing, so if a parent can pick a question that was answered incorrectly each week to work on, then the theory the children should get one more question correct every week!



Knowledge of times tables is also crucial to a child's and progress and attainment in maths. All children from Year 2 upwards should have access to Times Table Rockstars (if you don't have access or know the login details, please contact the class teacher). Children should access TTR at least once every week – using the programme has a real impact on how well children achieve in mathematics.



# NCRA Information and Lottery

What is NCRA? Newtown Community & Recreation Association (NCRA) is a registered charity and was formed in 1999. The charity purchased the land (outlined below) for the benefit of the Newtown area community and created a playing field, a community garden to celebrate the millennium, a playpark, and a car park.



The NCRA relies entirely on the support of volunteers, donations and grants to keep these facilities maintained and open. Over the past couple of years, the NCRA has embarked on a number of developments to the playground, the car park and a new community garden. This has not been possible without generous donations from local residents, parents/carers, and support from local businesses. We need to undertake continuous fundraising to be able to maintain and update these facilities for the benefit of everyone.

**How your donations help?** The playpark alone costs around £2,000 a year just to keep open! We also need to raise funds to maintain the car park, garden and for any repairs/upkeep of the area. The recent car park extension cost in excess of £31,500 and will cost the charity in excess of a further £20,000 to complete. If you enjoy using the play park and garden or use the car park, please consider making a donation to enable us to keep these facilities open for all to use or join our lottery.

Join the NCRA Lottery The NCRA Lottery is open to anyone (18 and over) and plays a vital role in raising funds to maintain the playpark, playing field, community garden and car park owned by the charity.

**Entry Fee and Application** To enter the lottery, all you need to do is complete an application form and pay a £15 entry fee. Your entry will cover 12 monthly draws.

**Draws** There is a monthly draw that takes place on or near to the last day of the month.

**Prizes** Each of the monthly draws comprises of two prizes as follows: 1st Prize - £10 2nd Prize - £5



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
