#### Message from the Head

As a school we play a key part in the small rural community of Newtown itself. A big part of this community is the excellent playpark and parking facilities that our school community uses every day.

This car park and playpark is completely separate to the school and is owned, run and maintained by the Newtown Community & Recreation Association. The NCRA is a registered charity and was formed in 1999 for the benefit of the Newtown community including the school.



The school does not directly contribute to the upkeep of either the playpark or car park, instead the NCRA relies entirely on the support of volunteers, donations and applies for grants in order to keep these facilities maintained and open.

To give you an idea of running costs, the playpark alone costs more than £2,000 a year just to keep open! This includes insurance, mandatory ROSPA inspections and new bark that must be topped up/replaced. Funds are also required to maintain the car park and for any repairs/upkeep of the area. The idea is that car park extension – which is currently suffering from potholes - will cost the charity in excess of £25,000 to complete.

Continuous fundraising is required to be able to maintain and update these facilities and the school will run certain events this year aimed to directly support the upkeep of this facility as we believe it is hugely beneficial to the parents and children of the school. However, the sad reality is that unless funding streams increase, there may be a time in the not-too-distant future which means the playpark and / or the car park would have to close.

#### How can you help?

The NCRA Lottery is the easiest way to support the continued use of the playpark and car park. The Lottery is open to anyone (18 and over) and is one of the funding activities that plays a vital role in raising funds to maintain the playpark and car park.

**Entry Fee, application and draws:** There are two options of how to join.

- 1 Fill in the forms that can be found in the school shelter.
- 2 Donate via School Money a link will be sent out to everyone next week which will involve the payment of a £15 donation and as a thank you, you will be automatically entered into the lottery for the next 12 months.

A draw takes place monthly with and the results of which will be circulated in the school newsletter.


#### **Forest School Timetable**

There is no Forest School for Kestrel Class next week, we'll be back on 19<sup>th</sup> March!




